

Transport and Traffic Subcommittee Terms of Reference 2024

Under its Constitution the objectives of the Glebe Society include improving the amenity of Glebe and Forest Lodge by

- promoting a better public transport system, both public and private, including facilities for pedestrians and cyclists
- achieving public access, both pedestrian and cycle, to the entire waterfront of Glebe
- opposing (by lawful means) developments detrimental to heritage values or contrary to community interests
- making Glebe and Forest Lodge a cleaner and healthier environment.

The Glebe Society pursues these objectives through its Transport and Traffic Subcommittee. The objectives of the Transport and Traffic Subcommittee are as follows:

1. To promote appropriate transport options for Glebe and Forest Lodge as densely populated inner-city suburbs.
2. To maintain and promote transport options suitable for Glebe and Forest as a village communities best served by public transport, walking and cycling.
3. To promote the development, maintenance and use of public transport in and around Glebe and Forest Lodge, including bus services, light rail services and a ferry service.
4. To reduce the use of private motor vehicles by the promotion of public transport, walking and cycling.
5. To support a system of vehicle parking management in Glebe and Forest Lodge that discourages commuter parking, gives residents, visitors and business operators parking priority and involves consultation with residents regarding appropriate parking controls.
6. To support the retention of the Glebe Island Bridge and its use for public transport, walking and cycling.
7. To oppose major infrastructure projects that have adverse impacts on the amenity of Glebe and Forest Lodge and work with other community groups and infrastructure operators to ameliorate those impacts.
8. To work with other Glebe Society subcommittees and other community groups and to make submissions and approaches to the City of Sydney, the State Government and other regulatory and governing bodies in support of these objectives.
