THE GLEBE SCCIETY NEWS BULLETIN

August 1969

The Glebe Society has been very busy during the past month and has featured several times in the daily Press. Our first general activity, the historic walk round Glebe, conducted by the convenor of our History sub-committee, Max Solling, was a great success. Over 70 members set out on the walk to inspect St. Scholasticus College, Camden College, St. John's Church, and other points of interest including the home of Dr. Vincent Sheppard. The walk ended at the home of Dennis Colsey, one of the Society's Vice-Presidents, where the Social Sub-Committee served afternoon tea. More walks around Glebe will be organised over the next few months.

## ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING

The Society's next general meeting will be the Annual General Meeting at Glebe Town Hall at 8 p.m. on Thursday September 4, 1969. After the constitution has been discussed and ratified, the President, Dr. Bernard Smith, will outline plans for a topographical and architectural survey of Glebe. Every member of the Society will be asked to help with this survey which will literally put Glebe on the map.

#### HARBOUR FORESHORES

The Society has written to Leichhardt Council expressing its appreciation of the Council's decision to insist on public access to the harbour foreshores in the form of a marine drive should the State Planning Authority decide to re-zone the timber yard area of Glebe Point for residential development.

# FLAT CODE

On the matter of the flat code, the Society has asked the Council to consider the new flat code proposed by the State Planning Authority. The Society believes that the S.P.A.'s code is more satisfactory than the code which applies to Leichhardt at present. The Society has also asked the Council to include Glebe in the present Leichhardt flat code as a temporary measure until the S.P.A.'s code can be fully studied. As things stand at present, the code under which Glebe operates is far inferior to even the present Leichhardt code.

# ARCADIA ROAD

A number of residents of Arcadia Road are concerned by a proposal to provide access from the foot of Arcadia Road to the new club house in Harold Park. The President of the Society has been informed by Ald. L. McMahon that the proposal was considered recently by the Council and rejected. More recently, however, Ald. McMahon stated that the Trotting Club was renewing its application. At the same time, construction work is being extended to within a few inches of the rock face at the end of the road. The residents are greatly concerned about the traffic, noise and dangers that an entrance to the offices, clubs and bars would induce. The matter is being actively investigated by the Society and the support of more Glebe residents may be sought.
