What lurks beneath the mop of grey hair and the brush of whiskers ?

Jim Coombs settled in Glebe in early 1973 with his wife Margaret and daughters Melanie and Sophie after four and a half years in London as Assistant Atomic Energy Representative in the Australian High Commission. His far-sightedness (despite the spectacles) can be seen in his shift from the Kings Road, Chelsea to Glebe Point Road.

He was around the "shop up the hill" for eight years before being sent off B.A., B.Ec. Once editor of Honi Soit (with Bob Ellis) and Vice President of the Union.

He now works as a hospital and health services planning consultant and maintains a life of bewildering complexity. He is presently also Secretary of the Medical Consumers Association, and the Sydney University Squash Club, Vice President of the Forest Lodge Primary Parents and Citizens' Association, Treasurer of the N.S.W. Branch of the Australian and New Zealand Society for Epidemiology and Research in Community Health, and a member of the ALP Phillip State Electorate Council and the Executive Council of the N.S.W. Federation of P. & C. Associations.

He was first elected to the Management Committee in August 1973, following the redoubtable Alan Robertson as Secretary.

His two years as Secretary (he's now into his third) have seen a persistent flow of letters to Ministers and Editors. He has co-authored Society papers on Child Welfare (with Julia McConnochie), and Railways (with John Gerofi) and delivered a paper on the case against expressways to the Australian Institute of Traffic Technology.

For the last two years he has captained the Glebe Society XI to victory, though this year we'll need a replacement for the mighty Don Plowman.

Although 1976 was a good year for the Society, it is worth noting the following facts true at the time of writing:

- * The rezoning of the Hudson's site on Blackwattle
 Bay for the High School has still to be made by
 the Minister for Planning and Environment, Mr
 Paul Landa (anyone with children should write to
 him now).
- * The Government has still not pronounced on the .
 fate of the North Western expressway and the illegal
 demolition in Fig St Ultimo has not resulted in any
 prosecution by the D.M.R.
- * The 1976 Leichhardt Town Plan may yet be adopted by the Planning and Environment Commission and that Plan will allow the sprouting of at least 3-storey units just about everywhere, containers on the waterfront and the expressways (write now to Minister Landa).
- The Glebe Project has had a reprieve for modest renovations.
- * Parkes Developments are under way at Glebe Point The bricks from "Venetia's" "mistakenly" demolished interior walls have been removed. Is this a prelude to the promised restoration. Watch that space.
- * Transport reform is slow. Leo Port has done little to provide a cycleway from Glebe to the City and the Public Transport Commission remains disinterested in a Glebe Ferry. All who are can join with the Secretary (and temporary editor) and other beleaguered city workers.
