
MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE MEETING

The Haberfield Association's Market Day will be held on this day at Dickson Street and St. Oswald's Anglican Church Hall with a variety of stalls and goods for sale.


The Ashfield and District Historical Society will present an exhibition Historical Haberfield and mini-bus tours and walking tour notes are available.

BI-CENTENNIAL PARK — Rozelle Bay

Further publicity for this large and important project resulted from a meeting in Jubilee Park on Sunday, 25th July at 11am. The meeting had been extensively advertised, particularly in shop windows, and the crowd of about seventy was enthusiastic.

John Buckingham outlined the history of the site, stressing the period when the waterfront was far more accessible than it is now. He made the merits of the Bruce McKenzie plan for a bicentennial park clear (the design is currently used as a model for council bi-centennial proposals) and brought us up to date on current negotiations with the Minister for Ports, Jack Ferguson.

Mr Ferguson has yet to make a final decision on the bi-centennial park proposals. John Buckingham urged the meeting to ensure the Minister's approval by writing to both Ferguson and our local member, Pat Hills to encourage them to transfer the land from the Maritime Services Board to Leichhardt Council. John stressed that the letters should convey the personal concern of members about such issues as lack of open space in Glebe, especially on the waterfront; the splendid conception and design of the plan itself, which would benefit not only Glebe and Annandale but the whole inner-city region; the current ugly appearance and inappropriate use of the site for storage of timber, and the adequate space available elsewhere for this purpose; and the fact that short leases and empty sites make it opportune now to re-create this only really substantial area left in Glebe as parkland.

ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING held 11th August, 1982

The President's Report was printed in the last edition of the Bulletin. The meeting also received reports from the Treasurer, the Residents' Planning Committee, Parks and Open Spaces, and Local History.

Residents' Planning Committee Alan Robertson reported.

- a) The Town Plan In response to the planning Board's request, the Leichhardt Council supplied detailed plans with specific justification for the reductions in residential densities in the new Town Plan. However, the Planning Director had peremptorily rejected Council's proposals, presumably a politically motivated decision.
- b) The University Hall development proposal is now approved, with balconies to be restored, and development in the rear to be substantial. Accommodation is to be leased and confined to University staff and students.
- c) The 461-5 Glebe Point Road development plan is now down to 33 large units, with three storeys facing the waterfront. Open waterfront space is to go to the Leichhardt Council, and eventually to connect to the Blackwattle Bay Park. However, the situation is dangerous as the rezoning is not specific to the proposed development.
- d) The Bird and Lucas site has been rezoned according to and approved plan.
- e) The Glebe High School is going ahead, but the TAFE proposal status is not known.
- f) The Glebe Point bus shelter and staff toilets are being rebuilt to fit in with Glebe.
- g) The 47-51 Hereford St site development application went to the Land and Environment Court where No. 47 was saved but the rest lost to unsatisfactory development.
- h) \$37,000 is available to restore Venetia.
- Leichhardt Council has not taken Lyndhurst over from the DMR, but has asked to be involved in planning.

Parks and Open Spaces

This report was delivered by John Buckingham and Bob Armstrong.

They particularly noted the change to working with Council rather than fighting them. Bicentennial Park is being promoted and supported, and the Blackwattle Bay Park has been something of a win. However, with little money, not much otherwise can be done, and the inland parts of Glebe are particularly disadvantaged. Various plans have been variously frustrated. The Year of the Tree is being followed up to improve the greening of Glebe.

Local History

Max Solling reported that in the last 12 months several talks had been given, and a paper on oral evidence presented. A history walk was held in April for members of the Society. Local publications include centenary histories of two local Masonic Lodges, and a history of the Children's Hospital in Glebe. Considerable work has been done on Glebe history of the First World War period, this including compilations of enlistments and deaths, study of activities of the Glebe Anti-German League. the tensions created over conscription, and the referendum on hotel trading hours. Two more issues of the Leichhardt History Journal should be published soon, and more talks on local matters are planned for the coming year.
