GLEBE AMALGAMATION ENQUIRY - Neil Macindoe

On 15th December 1983 I attended the Local Government Boundaries Commission Enquiry into proposed Council amalgamations and spoke in support of the Glebe Society's submission, opposing the transfer of Glebe from Leichhardt to the City.

My task was made much easier by the excellence of our written submission, which had impressed the Commission by its comprehensive conciseness and strong argument. It was written by Ted McKeown, and the Glebe Society is indebted to him for doing such a fine job in so short a time.

No one spoke in favour of the transfer of Glebe to the City. Sydney City Council had voted unanimously against the proposed transfer, and their representatives spoke strongly against it, as did the Mayor of Leichhardt. I had only to endorse the views of speakers from the City and Leichhardt and stress the lack of adequate reasons for a change.

At the time of writing, the report of the Commission has not been released, nor can they say when we can expect it. If the report does recommend the transfer of Glebe to the City, it will be interesting to see what reasons they can find.

MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE MEETINGS - DECEMBER AND JANUARY

Changes to Committee:

Peter Martin resigned from his position as President because of a posting to Fiji. (See p.1).

Neil Macindoe has been appointed to fill the position of President. Edwina Doe is now Senior Vice-President. Cleo Sabadine has been co-opted to the Committee. There is still a vacancy on the Committee, as Gladys Reid is now living in Melbourne.

Bi-Centennial Committee:

Neil Macindoe will represent the Glebe Society at the next meeting of this Committee. Tentative proposals being put forward by the Society are the Bi-Centennial Park, a history map and/or booklet of The Glebe and landscaping the grounds around Lyndhurst.

Lyndhurst:

The renovation of Lyndhurst is nearing completion. The house will be used by the Historic Houses Trust of N.S.W. The Secretary is contacting the Trust regarding possible use of Lyndhurst by the Glebe Society.

Cleanliness of The Glebe:

The Leichhardt Town Clerk has replied to our letter regarding "Pebble-Crete" litter bins. Apparently these bins were provided for use in the City by an advertising company as a limited promotion. However, the Town Clerk advised us:

"The matter of the adequacy of existing litter bins will be investigated, however, Council is concerned of the practice of many shopkeepers and residents depositing garbage and trade refuse in be-tidy bins, hence precluding their use for street litter. Council's Ordinance Inspector is currently patrolling Glebe shopping areas in the early morning to determine the persons responsible and discourage this practice."

We will watch out for improvements.

Advertising properties for sale:

Neil Macindoe raised the matter of Real Estate agents using coloured bunting on properties for sale. At the suggestion of the Committee, he later contacted

the Real Estate Institute for their comments. Apparently the bunting is used at the discretion of individual agents, so we will wait and see if the practice increases.

Homeopathic Hospital:

The Minister for Health wrote to tell us that changes in the role of the Hospital are no longer envisaged. The Secretary will write to the Hospital Board to advise them that we wrote to the Minister in support of their campaign. We will also ask the Hospital Board to consider removing the fence around the vacant block of land adjoining the Hospital, to give public access.

Social Calendar:

Several functions were proposed for the coming year. Some are announced in this Bulletin. Plans for others are still being finalised. Look out for further details.

Wentworth Park & Harold Park:

A sub-committee was proposed to monitor the increased use of these parks, and the possible effects on noise, parking and street cleanliness. Any members interested in joining this sub-committee should contact Neil Macindoe (660-0208).

All are welcome to come and browse. They are open every day from 10.30 a.m. except Sunday when they open from midday. (Phone 660 2768).


ANIMAL CORNER - Eileen Lacey

Hearing Dogs are a project of the Lions Clubs of Australia and New Guinea. There are only three in New South Wales, and one of them is in Glebe.

The dogs are specially trained to alert the deaf owner to sounds such as a ringing telephone, a knock at the door, an alarm clock, a baby crying, or unfamiliar sounds which may indicate some emergency.
