MANAGEMENT COMMITTEE MEETINGS DECEMBER AND JANUARY

The Society has been extremely active in recent months writing to the Leichhardt Council, the Premier and his Ministers and other relevant bodies regarding the many important issues which are of concern to Glebe residents.

More importantly, we have received prompt and understanding replies to most of these letters, proving that the Society is seen as a force to be reckoned with. Subjects covered by this correspondence include:

- the delay in renovating the Glebe Estate (prior to its transfer from the Federal to the State Government - see report on page 2).
- the latest freeway proposals and their possible effect on the hoped-for Rozelle Bay Bicentennial Park and on the quality of life of Ultimo residents.
- the Darling Harbour Development, which could increase traffic flow through Glebe.
- Strides Yard, on Blackwattle Bay, which contains some worthwhile buildings which appear to be in danger of demolition.
- the future of the site of 132 Glebe Point Road, which is part of the Glebe Estate.
- parking outside Wentworth Park kindergarten.

Other matters which the Committee is watching include:

- the Harold Park redevelopment.
- the Orphan School Creek Park area.
- possible Bicentennial funding for Venetia.
- the vacant land beside the Homeopathic Hospital in Glebe Point Road.

PICNIC IN THE PARK - SUNDAY, 10TH FEBRUARY

Bring all your friends and enough food and drink to satisfy them. A portable barbecue will be available for cooking.

TRANSFER OF GLEBE ESTATE

After a couple of fairly short delays before Christmas, the relevant ministers settled the terms of transfer of the Estate from Commonwealth to State.

The Society has been arguing strongly for transfer to the NSW Housing Commission ever since the future of the project was thrown into doubt by the Fraser Liberal Government. There is no doubt the invasion of the Estate by squatters added a much-needed air of urgency to the negotiations.

The terms of the transfer are favourable to New South Wales. The Committee understands that Federal and State governments will vote \$7m each in their next budgets toward the completion of the project. This will represent by far the largest public investment in the history of Glebe. Other public housing projects in Glebe make the total close to \$20m. The number of jobs created will be substantial.

All this is excellent news. The task before the Society is twofold: to ensure that the agreements are kept and that the work proceeds promptly, and to ensure facilities for the additional population are adequate, and additional building appropriate. The Housing Minister has already arranged discussions with the squatters.

CLOSURE OF WATER BOARD ROAD

The Society has been fighting for the closure of this road alongside the canal in Jubilee Park since the first proposal to create a waterfront bicentennial park. closure of Federal Road is an essential element in the projected park, and the closure of the narrow and dangerous water board road, confirmed in a letter to the Society from the Minister for Natural Resources, Janice Crosio, late last year, is the first stage in achieving this objective. should know by the end of February whether the waterfront MSB land will be released for use as parkland.

THEY'RE going to be sorry when the petrolruns, out ... Leichhardt Council staff that is. They removed a horse drinking trough from St Johns Road (Glebe) several months ago and are refusing to reinstall it. There are only two of the historic relics remaining in the municipality! Where will the horses go? A residents' group's requests that the trough be returned have been ignored. A council officer told The Glebe it was removed following complaints that it was being used as a urinal. "If the community can suggest an off-street site where it serves a better purpose, such as in an historic precinct, it will be installed, but it will not go back on a main thoroughfare." Psst. St Johns Road is an historic precinct, Mister councilman, sir.

DARLING HARBOUR

John Hoddinott is writing the Society's response to the Darling Harbour Bicentennial plan. Committee has already discussed the importance of local residents' involvement and reactions with the Darling Harbour Authority and has been promised the opportunity to address the Authority as well as represent local reactions. Committee is grateful to John for offering his expertise, especially in relation to light rail. We hope as many members as possible will view the proposals and send their reactions to the Authority.

Members will hardly need reminding that there is bound to be an impact on Glebe from the development of so many major projects on our eastern borders. As well as Darling Harbour, the Powerhouse Museum and the Sydney Fishmarkets project are due for completion by 1988. The Committee is particularly concerned that the new White Bay expressway takes account of these developments, and that the Glebe Traffic Study being undertaken in 1985 looks at likely future trends.

Bob, a member of the Society for many years, with a particular interest in Glebe's traffic and pollution problems, had a heart attack just before Christmas.

The Society expresses its sympathy to Bob's wife Jan and his two young daughters.


VISIT TO GLEBE HIGH SCHOOL - WEDNESDAY, 6TH MARCH - 5 p.m.
