The whole of the upper floor was proposed for public use, including tea rooms, public kitchen and toilets. and a small area for archives and information. Downstairs was to be a caretaker's flat. We were informed that it was a suitable Bicentennial project that would not conflict with Rozelle Bay Park.

Now we learn that Ald. Brian Thompson, who enjoys the distinction of representing Glebe without ever receiving a single vote, has let power go to his head and objected to the proposal. Thompson, in his brief period of public office, feels he wasn't sufficiently consulted.

MEETING WITH THE NSW HOUSING COMMISSION -

15TH AUGUST.

The special Meet the Members meeting to enable Members and residents of Glebe to hear the Commission's plans for the Glebe Estate attracted a capacity audience. Officers of the Commission turned out in force to explain their proposals and answer questions from the floor. It is pleasing to note that the Commission has agreed to attend a further meeting when its strategic plan for the area has been completed (expected mid-October).

Important information provided by the Commission at this meeting included the following:

- only 125 new dwellings are planned and the design will complement the existing houses. The streetscapes will be preserved.
- wherever possible, the existing unrenovated houses will be rehabilitated (ie a major renovation or even, in some cases, a reconstruction to bring the interiors up to modern standards and to increase the bedroom yield).
- a senior consultant has been employed to examine the impact of the development and the increased population on existing facilities and services. A report is expected in three months, following which any new needs identified will be taken up with the relevant authorities.
- the Society's efforts to obtain a greater proportion of open space, including street closures, will be supported in principal.
- no existing resident who wishes to remain in Glebe will be forced out of the area. A survey has been made among residents to establish their preferences and wherever possible, these will be accommodated.

NOTE FROM LEICHHARDT MUNICIPAL COUNCIL MEETING, 27th AUGUST, 1985 ITEM 1. GLEBE POINT ROAD.

Letter from Sydney County Council in response to representations by Cr. B. Thompson on behalf of the Glebe Society who requested that, because of the presence of poplar trees, consideration be given to the undergrounding of existing low voltage overhead electricity supply mains in Glebe Point Road, Glebe.

Advising that the Council did have a policy for undergrounding of low voltage mains, however because of

increasing difficulties and expense experienced in obtaining finance for essential capital work this policy was suspended in 1982 except where the cost involved was to be met by the party or parties requesting the undergrounding.

Stating that the present position is that Council does not have funds available for the undergrounding of mains however Council will undertake the undergrounding of existing mains at the request of a group of customers or another body if the party or parties involved are prepared to pay the full costs A11 associated with the conversion. customers must arrange at their own expense for the provision of a conduit from the street alignment to the customer's switchboard and must arrange for an electrical contractor to carry out any necessary alterations to the consumer's mains. In addition the local council must agree to meet the increased street lighting charges associated with column mounted lamps and underground mains. (File: Glebe Pt. Road, Glebe -General)

Recommendation: That the County Council be thanked for their advices and the information noted. Further that the Glebe Society be advised in accordance with the terms of the letter.

THE CHURCH OF ST. JOHN THE EVANGELIST.

BISHOPTHORPE, GLEBE - RESTORATION RECITAL.

You will be very familiar with St. John's Church on the corner of Glebe Point and St. John's Roads.

The foundation stone was laid in 1868 and the church was opened for worship in 1870. It was designed in Edmond Blackett's office and much of the work is said to have been done by his assistant, John Horbury Hunt.

To celebrate the Australian bicentenary, the parish council has decided to organise a programme of restoration of the church fabric. Quotes are now being obtained to estimate the cost of repairs to the stonework, roof and tower.

On Sunday 13th October at 3 pm a Restoration: Recital will be held in the church to launch an appeal for funds. The recital will feature Stephan Woolcott on the organ; Ruth and Arthur Lockley, vocalists; Frank Zuffo on trumpet; the playing of the bells and other items.

The cost of the programme will be \$4 for adults; \$2 for students and pensioners. Children will be admitted free.

The St. John's Parish extends an invitation to Members of the Glebe Society and would very much appreciate their interest and support.

AMNESTY INTERNATIONAL, GLEBE GROUP

Amnesty International plays a specific role in the international protection of human rights and its work is supported at the local level through fund raising activities and letter writing on behalf of the group's prisoner of conscience. The Glebe group is currently working on behalf of Victor Paredes, a peasant of Carrizal, in the Andean region of Cajamarca in Peru. He has been in gaol without a trial since January, 1984 and has been subjected to torture.
