Your President Edwina Doe is off to England to visit her family. We wish her Bon Voyage and safe return.


HAROLD PARK

OPEN SPACE ON GLEBE ESTATE

On 11 March, Leichhardt Council considered the Dept. of Housing's Strategy Plan for Eishopthorpe and ST Phillips, commonly but misleadingly known as the Glebe Estate.

Members will recall that in SEptember 1985 Council opposed the plan supported by the residents to make the Catherine Street triangle into a public park and to rehouse the aged on older suitable sites. At the 11 March meeting Council at the instigation of the Glebe aldermen. Cowley and Thompson also opposed the three road closures suggested by the Dept of Housing to ease the acute shortage of public open space. They did this despite the success of the Mitchell Street closure, which was of course initiated by the previous Council. There could hardly be a clearer indication that the present Council has abandoned the enlightened policies of the previous Council, includconsultation with residents. In opposing all the closures, the aldermen not only went against the wishes of the Dept of Housing but also the recommendation of the Municipal Engineer. Fortunately, other recommendations by Council's Planning Dept for improved

ENVIRONMENT GALA DAY

The Rally in Jubilee Park on 9 March was organised by the Save Rozelle Bay Campaign. It brought together local action groups such as the Glebe Society, Annandale Association, Paddington Society as well as specific issue groups such as those formed to oppose the monrail and the Leura Escarpment Development.

The gathering was addressed by several highly qualified speakers. Among them were:

- Dr. Harris, an urban planning expert who stressed the need for action groups to be reasonable in their demands all areas/suburbs should expect some "good" things together with some "bad".
- Professor Runcie, who campaigned strongly and successfully against the Moore Park development some years ago ranged over the "bad" decisions of the last few years - Moore Park, Parramatta Park, Leura, the Monorail....
- Mr. Tim Hoore, Shadow Minister for the Environment and Planning contended that no matter which party is in power "good" development will be in marginal seats, while "bad" development will take place in both "safe" and "unwinnable" seats.
- Jack Mundey, Sydney City Alderman and former "Green bans" leader spoke out strongly against arrangements made for political expediency. Not notable were the Labor/Liberal City Council Coalition and the governments legislation circumventing its own legislation to establish the Land and Environment Court and exercised to the detriment of the environment in Parramatta Park, at Leura, with the Monorail and at Darling Earbour. He exhorted action groups to become even more vigilant in the protection of their environment. Because the government can by-pass the protective instruments, local groups must use the politics of members to ensure the well-being of their area.

BI CENTENNIAL PARK ROZELLE BAY

The campaign to get the original proposal accepted must continue. While on its own the M.S.B. compromise plan for waterfront park on the Glebe side of Rozelle Bay is a great step forward, the gains are nullified by the M.S.B. plan for the Annandale side.Offensive aspects of this part of the plan include:

- the loss of waterfront access at present available on the Annandale site.
- the loss of Federal Park.
- the filling in of several acres on the waterfront and of Rozell Park.
- the building of a massive workshop (at a cost of \$20 million) that will occupy land from the viaduct (and be as high as the viaduct) through to the reclaimed land at the water's edge. We are planning to mount a massive demonstration in late May/ early June to coincide with the publication of the Environmental Impact Statements on the project. It is hoped all members, their families and friends will attend the proposed rally.
